## Executive Summary

The NYS 250 Commemoration Commission strategic plan is to commemorate not just the events surrounding the Declaration of Independence in 1776, but the entirety of two hundred and fifty years of America. While traditional commemorations of the Declaration of Independence have tended to focus on the actions of a small group of individuals and political developments, the enabling legislation for the commission encourages the recognition that the history of the United States is an unfinished revolution and is an ongoing quest to fulfil its stated values. Accordingly, the Commission recommends a commemoration that recognizes the underrepresented. Indigenous history is New York's history. The ideals of the revolution remain a guiding principle for our country. Where the commemoration of the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Declaration to be funded by New York State, the Commission recommends keeping that pursuit as a central focal point for its work.

Dear Governor Hochul, Majority Leader Stewart-Cousins, and Speaker Heastie:

Herein you will find the strategic plan of the New York State 250 Commemoration Commission.

On May 15, 2024, the Commission held its first meeting and set out to create a strategic plan in accordance with its statutory mandate under §14.12 of the Parks Law. At the Commission's second meeting on October 23, 2024, we reviewed the draft of the plan and tasked a subcommittee with making some final adjustments. At our March 12, 2025 meeting, we approved the strategic plan and now provide it to you.

In this plan, we took care to keep the statement of legislative intent in our focus. Acknowledging that the American Revolution was imperfect is an important step in developing a commemoration of a society that continues to grow and improve with the participation of an active, committed and engaged citizenry.

We encourage you to review our plan and welcome your support for commemorating the 250th anniversary of this country's declaring its independence. The Revolutionary period of 1775-1783 had a profound impact on the historic and contemporary state of New York; this plan supports and advises the uplift and funding of commemorative activities throughout the conclusion of the Commission's term in 2033.

## I. Overview

The New York State 250th Commemoration Commission was created by Chapter 73 of the Laws of 2022.

The powers, functions, and duties of the New York State 250th Commemoration Commission include:

- Develop plans to promote and coordinate activities to commemorate the two hundred fiftieth anniversary of the American Revolution.
- Include heritage organizations as the focal points for the commemoration; heritage organizations are defined in the statute as an organization “whose mission is to preserve and promote the history of a locale, region, people, or the entirety of the state.”
- Coordinate forums across the state to seek ideas from the public on the commemoration including how New Yorkers, American and those from other countries may celebrate the anniversary;
- Coordinate activities with civic, educational and heritage organizations to develop public interest and involvement in the planning and development of the commemoration;
- Promote and encourage educational outreach programs using media and technology including electronic communications to achieve national and international impact;
- Coordinate the planning of commemorative events for all interested communities throughout the state;
- Invite other interested states and nations to participate in programs and events for the commemoration;
- Coordinate and promote the holdings of meetings, conference, seminars and conventions in interested communities using such anniversary as an attraction and theme;
- Coordinate and promote the holding of community engagement and educational events in interested communities using such anniversary as an attraction and theme;
- Seek funding from private individuals, foundations and corporations to support capital improvements, preservation and conservation needs associated with events and sites commemorating such anniversary;
- Coordinate and cooperate with state entities and tourist promotion agencies;
- Coordinate and cooperate with local, state and federal entities including those relating to heritage area promotion and any federal commission created to participate in planning and development of the anniversary;
- Set goals and benchmarks for the work of the commission.

The commission shall dissolve on December 31, 2033.

The Commission is created in accordance with Parks Law 14.12, included here as Appendix A.

## II. Make-up of the Commission

The Commission consists of 21 members as listed below. Members consist of the Commissioner of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, the Commissioner of Education, the President and Chief Executive Officer of Empire State Development, the Commissioner of the Office of General Services, the Secretary of State, the Chair of the Council for the Arts, and the Director of the Canal Corporation

(or their designees) as well as four members appointed by the governor, three appointed by the temporary president of the Senate, three appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly, one appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate, and one appointed by the Minority Leader of the Assembly, and the New York State Historian. The majority of the members that make up the commission shall have a professional background in the fields of local government historian, academic historian, museum professional, social studies teacher or professor, tourism professional, archeologist, anthropologist, or other field of New York State history or historic preservation, or volunteer fundraising experience.

### III. Legislative intent

The Commission's enabling legislation is attached in appendix A. The language states that New York played "an immense role in the lead up to and execution of the American Revolution during the period of 1774-1783, and was the site of several important battles, skirmishes and other events that were internationally significant during the Revolutionary era," but that the imperfect revolution and its ideals did not extend to many, "including women, African Americans, and Native Americans," and that New York has been the site of "the ongoing struggle to fully realize the ideals of the Revolution" for the last 250 years.

In recognition of these points and out of recognition of the impact of the 1976 bicentennial commemoration, the bill expressly puts forth its intent as follows:

Therefore, it is the intention of the legislature to establish a commission to make recommendations for planning and development for the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution in New York state to take place in coordination with the national celebration.

### IV. Strategic Plan

The Commission's enabling statute states:

- (a) the commission shall develop a strategic plan, which shall recommend plans for commemorating the state's role in the founding of the nation and the ensuing two hundred fifty years of history.
- (b) The strategic plan shall be consistent with existing management plans for resources included in the plan.
- (c) Such strategic plan may include, but shall not be limited to, a survey or inventory of the following, together with the establishment of management priorities thereof:
  - (i) historic, cultural and other heritage resources;
  - (ii) scenic resources; and
  - (iii) educational and recreational resources
- (d) The commission may provide grants to heritage organizations for projects recommended in the strategic plan and may provide letters of support for grant applications for projects or programs recommended in the plan.

### V. Vision Statement

The New York State 250th Commemoration Commission shall provide leadership that recognizes New York's crucial role in the American Revolution and the ongoing struggle of marginalized groups

to achieve the ideals of the Revolution. The Revolutionary period of 1775-1783 revealed core American values that have been a goal for people worldwide ever since. In recognition of this fact, the commission shall engage with diverse audiences and support statewide educational programming, exhibits, events, and marketing for the state's historic, cultural, heritage, scenic and recreational resources.

## VI. Six Interpretive Themes

*In pursuit of the goals stated by the enacting legislations' statement of intent, these themes inform the organizational framework for the commission's work:*

- 1) Indigenous History is New York's History - highlight indigenous history which is often absent in the public understanding of New York history from the time of the Revolution to the present.
- 2) Choose Your Side - Recognize that the political, economic, and social contours of the Revolutionary period in New York did not express a unified monolithic "truth." The Revolutionary War was a civil war for most people. From the outset, New York and the United States have been characterized by their diversity and the often uneven quest for equality in that society. The New Yorker Walt Whitman reminds us:

Do I contradict myself?  
Very well then I contradict myself,  
(I am large, I contain multitudes.)

- 3) Power of Place - While New York's role in the Revolution was overwhelmingly geographically determined, the state's modern boundaries contain uniquely important physical places from American history, from the battlefields at Saratoga to Seneca Falls to the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory and Stonewall Inn in Greenwich Village.
- 4) We the People - While it may have been written outside of the actual revolutionary period, the Constitution opens in the words of New Yorker Gouverneur Morris, echoing its sentiments with the phrase "We the People," he and the other authors of the constitution failed to provide recognition or civic equality to women, the enslaved, people without real property, and the original native population. Only the ratification of the fourteenth amendment in 1868 putatively extended citizenship to all men born in the United States. The implementation of the rights inherent in citizenship would not be guaranteed until the civil rights acts passed during the Lyndon Johnson's administration from 1963-68. Women, representing half the overall population would only be given the vote in 1920; their civil and legal rights not protected until the 1970s. The citizenship of Indigenous people was made legal only in 1924.
- 5) Unfinished Revolutions - The promise of equality and inclusion remains unfulfilled even today. New York's role in the unfinished revolution has included significant movements such as abolitionism, the Timbuktu settlement in the Adirondacks, and a precursor to the NAACP, the Niagara Movement under the leadership W.E.B. Dubois.

- 6) Changing interpretations of the Revolution - As our founding principles are being extended to respect all Americans, the public sphere is witnessing the development of a more varied, accurate and fair account of the nation's history.

## VII. GOALS, PRIORITIES, AND STRATEGIES:

*The New York State 250th Commemoration Commission has identified the following goals, priorities, and strategies for its support of statewide and local 250th commemoration initiatives.*

### Goal #1:

*Focus on the revolutionary actions of New Yorkers and the ever-evolving process by which they have fought to bring the nation closer to its founding principles through the telling of a diverse, inclusive, and accurate history.*

#### Priorities for Goal #1:

1. Promote the histories and voices of previously silenced or marginalized communities, including, but not limited to, women, African-Americans, people of color, Indigenous peoples, and members of the LGBTQ+ community, are centered, included, and prioritized throughout the commemoration.
2. Increase the diversity of the people engaging with history to better reflect New York's demographics, including encouraging the diversification of the leadership, staff, volunteers, and boards of New York's heritage organizations and local government historians.
3. Encourage the expansion of resources for heritage organizations and local government historians to conduct community outreach to engage and serve underrepresented audiences.
4. Improve the quality of historic interpretation statewide by encouraging the production of accurate, inclusive, and relevant history.
5. Initiate and encourage programs that explore the full scope of New York's history before, during, and after the Revolution and highlight its relevance to contemporary issues.

#### Strategies for Goal #1

1. Encourage the diversification of heritage organization and local government historian collections to be more representative and inclusive of New York's diverse past and present.
2. Provide and encourage the production of new historical research that will lead to new interpretations of New York's history with particular focus on topics that have been underrepresented or misrepresented in the past.
3. Provide resources to heritage organizations and local government historians for projects that focus on long-term sustainability and that reach new and diverse audiences.
4. Provide resources to address the inaccuracies of prior commemorative events, the messaging on monuments and signage, with specific reference to the commemorative monuments marking the Sullivan campaign of 1779.

### Goal #2:

*Elevate the value placed on history and civics education in K-12 schools and higher education institutions.*

### Priorities for Goal #2

1. To ensure that commemoration educational programming aligns with the NYSED K-12 Social Studies framework and learning standards, as well as the New York State Board of Regents Civic Readiness Initiative to empower all students to make informed decisions for the public good as members of a culturally diverse democratic society in an interdependent world.
2. Increase the direct contact the students have with heritage organizations, museums, local government historians, primary sources, and other historical resources.
3. Increase the public's awareness of how history education prepares students for workforce readiness by providing skills such as critical thinking, media literacy, use of primary and secondary sources, synthesizing information and forming evidence-based conclusions.

### Strategies for Goal #2

1. Facilitate the development of the "Tapestry of New York" statewide quilting project by which each school district in the state will design its own unique block of the quilt which will focus on how that district's students interpret the legacy of the American Revolution. Local BOCES will then help create each of the district blocks. Once completed, the quilt will be assembled and displayed at the New York State Museum in Albany and other venues around the state.
2. Provide a template for the "Revolution in My Back Yard" program to will enable school student field trips to local heritage organizations, state and national historic sites, and Indigenous nation cultural centers to experience programming, exhibits, and primary source materials related to the American Revolution in New York State and the themes outlined above. The program will also help to facilitate the bringing of related historical artifacts, documents, maps, and other primary source materials from local heritage organizations, state and national historic sites, and Indigenous nation cultural centers, into local school classrooms.
3. Facilitate the development of teacher guides and other teacher resources that highlight best practices for teaching the American Revolution in New York State and ways to incorporate historical artifacts, documents, maps, and other primary source materials from heritage organizations, state and national historic sites, and Indigenous nations from around the state.
4. Facilitate the development of educational content, including online resources, at heritage organizations and local government historian offices that align with the NYSED K-12 Social Studies framework and the New York State Board of Regents Civic Readiness Initiative.
5. Encourage and facilitate partnerships between heritage organizations, local government historians, schools, and universities.
6. Provide examples of programming and exhibits that increase the public's understanding of the importance of historical skills such as critical thinking, media literacy, the use of primary and secondary sources, synthesizing information and forming evidence-based conclusions in a diverse, democratic society.
7. Build upon opportunities to increase history education at the primary, secondary, and higher education levels.

Goal #3:

*Invest in the state's historic sites operated by the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP) to ensure that these sites have the programming capacity needed to meet the needs of visitors well beyond the commemorative era.*

Priorities for Goal #3

1. Address the backlog of capital needs at the state's historic sites.
2. Ensure that visitor center, multimedia, and exhibit content at the state's historic sites is made available online for students and other interested individuals.
3. Ensure that the state's historic sites have interactive material related to New York's role in the American Revolution.

Strategies for Goal #3

1. Identify funding to allow OPRHP to expand its current inventory of visitor center, multimedia, and exhibit content and make as much of the material available online as possible.
2. Identify funding for the building of twenty additional "Revisit the Revolution" kiosks at state historic sites.
3. Facilitate, host and promote commemoration related events, including reenactments, at state historic sites.
4. Implement capital improvements at State Historic Sites consistent with the goals of the 250 Commission.
5. Invest in climate-controlled curatorial infrastructure for the one-million-plus artifacts held by OPRHP.

Goal #4:

*Encourage the sustainability of New York heritage organizations so that they are better able to educate and serve visitors long after the commemorative era.*

Priorities for Goal #4

1. Encourage staff development and organizational best practices for all heritage organizations and local government historians in New York State.
2. Promote the development and implementation of innovative historical programs and exhibits that engage wide and diverse audiences at New York's heritage organizations and through the work of local government historians.
3. Support investment in the conservation, stewardship, interpretation and public access to historic collections and capital investments to secure the long-term sustainability of heritage organizations.

4. Encourage and provide best practices in support of the diversification of collections to better represent the full spectrum of New York's history.

#### Strategies for Goal #4

1. Provide digital guide to resources for staff development and training in best practices for staff, board members and volunteers of heritage organizations as well as local government historians.
2. Provide digital guide to resources for the planning and development of programs and exhibits that are historically accurate, inclusive, accessible and engaging.
3. Provide digital guide to resources for capital and preservation projects to preserve and protect historic resources.
4. Invest in infrastructure for digitization of historic artifacts, media, and journals.
5. Support the diversification and stewardship of collections.

#### Goal #5:

*Encourage heritage tourism in New York State to further the preservation and promotion of historical and scenic resources and increase the positive impact to the state and local economy.*

#### Priorities for Goal #5

1. Facilitate, promote, and support sustainable partnerships between heritage organizations and tourism promotion agencies to strengthen the heritage tourism infrastructure and better facilitate the promotion of visitation to the state's heritage tourism destinations.
2. Leverage the strengthened heritage tourism infrastructure to reach new audiences and provide an inclusive and historically accurate experience at all heritage organizations.
3. Support a variety of interpretations and programing that is germane to local history.

#### Strategies for Goal #5

1. Work closely with tourism promotion agencies in the state to promote New York's historical resources, events and sites.
2. Produce and encourage marketing planning and promotion by and for New York's heritage organizations and local government historians.
3. Promote heritage organization and municipal programs and exhibits that attract visitors from both the local community and further afield.

#### Goal #6:

*Renew the public's engagement with history by facilitating an understanding of the evolving process of history production.*

Priorities for Goal #6

1. Facilitate an expansion of the interpretive content at New York’s heritage organizations and the work of local government historians to reflect the complex nature of history, including how the quest for liberty and equality coexist with oppression and injustice.
2. Facilitate an increase in public understanding of how history is produced, including how evidence is used to support interpretation.

Strategies for Goal #6

1. Support programs for heritage organizations and local government historians that illuminate the process of historical production and result in a more nuanced and inclusive understanding of the past.
2. Support the development of communication materials and programs focusing on the relevance of history in our current world.
3. Digitally publish, with public input, a chronology of events relating to the revolutionary period in New York state.

**VIII. FUNDING:**

These six goals cannot be implemented without robust funding. The Commission’s enabling legislation allows for the Commission to receive a state budget appropriation for its work as well as to accept federal funds and to raise private funding. The legislation prescribes that 45% of the Commission funds be directed to OPRHP for its work related to state historic sites and 45% to the State Education Department (SED) for regrants that align with the goals outlined here. The remaining 10% is set aside for administration.

While these percentages are set in statute, it must be emphasized that within those categories, a clear and explicit commitment to spending on behalf of the underrepresented people of our history must be made. Achieving these six goals will require the pursuit of funding levels that represent the diversity of the state and that reach beyond the often too narrow geographical areas of previous commemorations.

The Commission recommends the following in the state budget projects and programs. Note that expenditures will necessarily precede the specific event to be commemorated, as commemoration planning precedes actual events, such that larger appropriations should be at the first years.

## Appendix A: Legislation and Authorizing Statute

Statement of Legislative intent in ch.73, Laws of 2002:

*§ 2. Legislative findings and intent. The legislature finds that New York played an immense role in the lead up to and execution of the American Revolution during the period of 1774-1783, and was the site of several important battles, skirmishes and other events that were internationally significant during the Revolutionary era. The American Revolution itself was imperfect and many, including women, African Americans, and Native Americans, did not benefit from its ideals of liberty and freedom. However, the struggle to fully realize the ideals of the Revolution has continued over the past 250 years as is evident in New York's leading role in such revolutionary civil rights movements as the women's rights and abolitionist movements, the underground railroad, and the LGBTQ movement.*

*The legislature further finds that the Bicentennial of the American Revolution in 1976 drew international attention and attendance at events and sites across New York and the nation and had a lasting impact on historical education and public history. The legislature further finds that the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution should also be an occasion for recognition of New York's vital role in the Revolution itself as well as the ongoing struggle of marginalized groups to achieve the ideals of the Revolution. This commemoration should be statewide, involving all the people of the state through imaginative and innovative programs, grants, events, exhibits, new and expanded facilities, and marketing to engage the people of the nation and from all parts of the world.*

*The legislature further finds that the 250th anniversary and the years proceeding it offers great opportunity to educate and inspire the people of the state to increase recognition and appreciation of New York's role in the American Revolution and subsequent civil rights struggles as well as the complex nature of the state and nation's history with regards to the ideals of liberty and freedom. Therefore, it is the intention of the legislature to establish a commission to make recommendations for planning and development for the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution in New York state to take place in coordination with the national celebration.*

Section 3 of the statute amends the State Finance Law section 95-j to create a New York state two hundred fiftieth commemoration fund" to hold all appropriations and donations to the commission. It creates an allocation formula as follows:

*2. Moneys in such fund shall consist of all moneys appropriated for the purpose of such fund, donations to the New York state two hundred fiftieth commemoration commission created by section 14.12 of the parks, recreation and historic preservation law and all moneys appropriated, credited or transferred thereto from any other fund or source pursuant to law. Any interest received by the comptroller on money on deposit in the fund shall be retained in and become part of the fund.*

*3. Moneys within such fund shall be made available to the New York state two hundred fiftieth commemoration commission for payment of costs and expenditures for the following purposes:*

*(a) no more than ten percent annually for the operation and activities of such commission;*

*(b) no less than forty-five percent annually directed to the New York state museum for grants to local governments and heritage organizations upon recommendation of the commission for historic programming, preservation and natural area protection and management relating to the New York state two hundred fiftieth commemorations, and other heritage projects like the underground railroad, women's suffrage, and civil rights sites as such commission shall identify through*

*its strategic plan as described in paragraph (c) of subdivision four of section 14.12 of the parks, recreation and historic preservation law. This grant program shall be administered by the office of state history;*

*and*

*(c) no less than forty-five percent annually directed to the office of parks, recreation and historic preservation for capital improvements for the state's historic sites and programming, preservation and outreach relating to the New York state two hundred fiftieth commemorations.*

*4. Monies shall be payable from the fund on the audit and warrant of the comptroller on vouchers approved and certified by such commission.*

Statutory authorization appears in NYS Parks Law:

**§ 14.12 New York state two hundred fiftieth commemoration commission.**

1. As used in this section, the following terms shall mean and include:

(a) "Commission" means the New York state two hundred fiftieth commemoration commission created by subdivision two of this section.

(b) "Heritage organization" means a historic site, historical society, battlefield, historic park, history-based museum, friends groups, library, archive, academic institute, historical anniversary organization, historical awareness group or Native American cultural center whose mission is to preserve and promote the history of a locale, region, people, or the entirety of the state.

2. (a) The office shall create the New York state two hundred fiftieth commemoration commission. From the effective date of this section until December thirty-first, two thousand thirty-three, such commission shall develop plans to promote and coordinate activities to commemorate the two hundred fiftieth anniversary of the American Revolution. Such plans may include:

(i) including heritage organizations as the focal points for the commemoration;

(ii) coordinating forums across the state to seek ideas from the public on the commemoration including how New Yorkers, Americans and those from other countries may celebrate such anniversary;

(iii) coordinating activities with civic, educational and heritage organizations to develop public interest and involvement in the planning and development of the commemoration;

(iv) promoting and encouraging educational outreach programs using media and technology including electronic communications to achieve national and international impact;

(v) coordinating the planning of commemorative events for all interested communities throughout the state;

(vi) inviting other interested states and nations to participate in programs and events for the commemoration;

(vii) coordinating and promoting the holding of meetings, conferences, seminars and conventions in interested communities using such anniversary as an attraction and theme;

(viii) coordinating and promoting the holding of community engagement and educational events in interested communities using such anniversary as an attraction and theme;

(ix) seeking funding from private individuals, foundations and corporations to support capital improvements, preservation and conservation needs associated with events and sites commemorating such anniversary;

(x) coordinating and cooperating with state entities and tourist promotion agencies, as defined in article five-A of the economic development law;

(xi) coordinating and cooperating with local, state and federal entities including those relating to heritage area promotion and any federal commission created to participate in planning and development of such anniversary observance; and

(xii) setting goals and benchmarks for the work of the commission.

(b) The commission may coordinate and consult with the New York state military museum and veterans research center, Saratoga national historical park, Champlain Valley National Heritage Partnership, Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor, Maurice D. Hinchey Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area, Niagara Falls National Heritage Area, Humanities New York, Association of Public Historian of New York State, the Preservation League of New York State, national historic landmarks, national historic landmark stewardship organizations and any other organizations it deems necessary in the development, planning, promotion and coordination of activities to commemorate the two hundred fiftieth anniversary of the American Revolution.

(c) The commission may coordinate and consult with each of the following: the Cayuga Nation, the Oneida Indian Nation, the Onondaga Indian Nation, the Saint Regis Mohawk Tribe, the Seneca Nation of Indians, the Shinnecock Indian Nation, the Stockbridge-Munsee Community Band of Mohican Indians, the Tonawanda Band of Seneca, and the Tuscarora Nation.

(d) The commission shall consist of twenty-one voting members to be appointed as follows:

(i) the commissioner or his or her designee;

(ii) the commissioner of the department of education or his or her designee;

(iii) the president and chief executive officer of empire state development or his or her designee;

(iv) the commissioner of the office of general services;

(v) the secretary of state or his or her designee;

(vi) chair of the New York state tourism advisory council or his or her designee;

(vii) chair of the council for the arts or his or her designee;

- (viii) director of the canal corporation or his or her designee;
- (ix) four members shall be appointed by the governor, three members shall be appointed by the temporary president of the senate, three members shall be appointed by the speaker of the assembly, one member shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate and one member shall be appointed by the minority leader of the assembly, to the extent practicable, these appointments shall include a representative from each of the ten regional economic development councils; and
- (x) the New York state historian.

(d) To the extent practicable, such appointees shall have a professional background in one or more of the following fields: local government historian, academic historian, museum professional, social studies teacher or professor, tourism professional, archeologist, anthropologist, or other expertise in the field of New York state history and/or historic preservation, or professional or volunteer fundraising experience.

(e) The commissioner and the commissioner of the department of education shall be co-chairpersons of the commission. Vacancies in the membership of the commission shall be filled in the same manner provided for original appointments.

(f) A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.

(g) The members of the commission shall receive no compensation for their services but shall be allowed their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

(h) The commission shall hold a meeting at least once each quarter.

3. The commission shall have the power:

- (a) to prepare, publish and disseminate information or reports to highlight for state agencies, local governments, and the general public issues, problems, and opportunities relevant to the two hundred fiftieth anniversary of the American Revolution;
- (b) to assist local governments and other appropriate organizations to plan commemorations of the two hundred fiftieth anniversary of the American Revolution, and to do this, as far as possible, through cooperation and through technical assistance, including planning assistance, citizen education and participation assistance, and assistance in preparation of grant applications to other entities;
- (c) to apply for and receive funds from the federal and state government;
- (d) notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of law, to solicit and accept gifts for the purpose of furthering the objectives of the commission pursuant to this section;
- (e) to conduct historical, economic and cultural studies;
- (f) to conduct education programs;

(g) to assist individuals, corporations, heritage organizations and other public entities on ways to protect and promote the heritage resources of the state;

(h) to prepare an annual report on the conduct of its activities which shall be delivered to the governor, temporary president of the senate, and the speaker of the assembly by January first;

(i) to serve a coordinating role in utilizing the capabilities of other organizations to carry out the duties prescribed in this section; and

(j) to exercise and perform such other powers and duties as shall have been or may be conferred by law.

4. (a) The commission shall develop a strategic plan, which shall recommend plans for commemorating the state's role in the founding of the nation and the ensuing two hundred fifty years of history.

(b) The strategic plan shall be consistent with existing management plans for resources included in the plan.

(c) Such strategic plan may include, but shall not be limited to, a survey or inventory of the following, together with the establishment of management priorities thereof: (i) historic, cultural and other heritage resources; (ii) scenic resources; and (iii) educational and recreational resources.

(d) By December thirty-first, two thousand twenty-two, the commission shall vote to finalize the recommendation contained in the strategic plan. A copy of the strategic plan shall be provided to the governor, the temporary president of the senate and the speaker of the assembly.

(e) The commission may propose amendments to the strategic plan described in this subdivision as they are deemed to be necessary and appropriate.

5. To effectuate the purposes of this section, the commission may request from any department, board, bureau, commission or other agency of the state, and the same are authorized to provide, such cooperation and assistance, services and data as will enable the commission to properly carry out its functions pursuant to this section.

6. In administering the provisions of this section, the commission may make, within the limitations of appropriations available thereof, grants to heritage organizations towards the costs of a project recommended in the plan. The commission may submit letters of support for grant applications submitted by an organization for projects or programs recommended in the plan.

## Appendix B: Commission Member Biographies

**David Allen** teaches history, maritime history, museum studies and research methods within the Humanities Department at the State University of New York's Maritime College in the Bronx, New York. His concentration is American history and American maritime history. A native of a St. Louis suburb (across the bridge in southern Illinois), he has been researching and teaching American history since 1985, and has worked in traditional high school, junior high, and college, as well as on a wagon train, aboard tall ships, in museums, and for a national maritime history magazine, *Sea History*. He studied American History, with a concentration in Maritime History, from Southern Illinois University, and, then, after crewing aboard various tall ships and Mississippi River tugboats, Allen came to New York to work an educator aboard the Hudson River sloop *Clearwater*. Allen worked as the Director of Marine Education at New York's South Street Seaport Museum and then as the Director of Education for the National Maritime Historical Society. He has collaborated with groups such as NASA, the Naval Underwater Warfare Center, myriad museums and other non-profit educational institutions, as well as the History Channel. In addition, Mr. Allen works as the assistant collections manager and is an active member of the Board of the Museum of Merchant Shipping, situated within the historic Fort Schuyler, on the campus of the Maritime College in the Bronx. Raised with fifteen siblings, David (the smartest and best-looking of the lot) has had to learn to adapt and collaborate. He brings these skills (as well as a middle-child's craving for attention) to his teaching style.

**Barbaralee Diamonstein-Spielvogel** is the first woman to serve in a leadership position on the U.S. Commission of Fine Arts. She is known as a preservationist and advocate for the arts, and the author of twenty books, media programs, and numerous articles on the arts, architecture, design, and public policy. She received a doctorate from New York University in 1963 and became a staff assistant at the White House involved in the development of the White House Fellows and Presidential Scholars Programs. In 1966, Diamonstein-Spielvogel became the first director of cultural affairs for the City of New York, a position she held for five years, followed by fifteen years on the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission (1972–87) and eight years as chairman of the New York Landmarks Preservation Foundation (1987–95). She was also a founding board member of the New York Landmarks Conservancy and chairman of the Historic Landmarks Preservation Center. She is a member of the New York State Council on the Arts and an advisor on public art and architecture to the New York Port Authority at the World Trade Center. She has taught at Hunter College, the New School-Parsons School of Design, and Duke University. Diamonstein-Spielvogel is an honorary member of the American Institute of Architects and has received honorary degrees from the Maryland Institute of Art and Baltimore College of Art. Her papers are in the Rare Book and Manuscript Library at Duke University.

**Dr. Georgette Grier-Key** is an internationally recognized historian, educator, advocate, and Culture Leader. She is the executive director and chief curator of Eastville Community Historical Society. Additionally, Dr. Grier-Key is professor at Medgar Evers College, specializing in the development of the United States of America and the modern Civil Rights Movement. She is an avid practitioner of grounded theory and sustainability models used to disrupt the agenda of traditional frameworks that have practiced institutional and structural exclusion. Grier-Key is a well-regarded guest curator and consultant. She has been elected to various outlets that inform and further the study of art, history, preservation, and culture. Notably, Grier-Key is the president of the Museum Association of New York and serves as the vice president of the New York State Preservation League. Dr. Grier-Key is a New York State 250th Commemoration Commissioner. She is also proud to have been the inaugural historian and curator of Drowned Meadow Cottage Museum solely

responsible from 2015-2022 and led the museum on its path to recognition. She secured Port Jefferson's Washington Spy Trail's national designation, state historic marker, permanent collections and sustained funding and her work constitutes the framework for what exists today. As a NAACP Brookhaven branch president, she is working to fulfill their mission to achieve equity, political rights, and social inclusion by advancing policies and practices that expand human and civil rights, eliminate discrimination, and accelerate well-being, education, and economic security of the BIPOC community. She is one of the most outspoken advocates using and teaching cultural competence in celebration of Long Island's rich history of African American culture and BIPOC heritage. As a founding member and lead organizer of the Pyrrhus Concer Action Committee her expertise in preservation is leading to the rebuilding of the formerly enslaved Pyrrhus Concer's homestead in the heart of Southampton's Village.

**Steve Israel** served in the U.S. Congress between 2001–2017, including 4 years as chairman of the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee (2011–2015). He left Washington - unindicted and undefeated - to pursue new passions. In 2021 he opened a small independent bookshop, Theodore's Books, in his historic hometown of Oyster Bay, fulfilling a lifelong dream. He also directs the nonpartisan Institute of Politics and Global Affairs at the Jeb S. Brooks School of Public Policy at Cornell University. He has published two critically acclaimed satires of Washington: *The Global War on Morris* (2014) and *Big Guns* (2018). He proudly serves on the Library of Congress Madison Council, the Presidents Committee on the Arts and Humanities, as well as many other boards of directors. He lives with his wife Cara in Oyster Bay, Long Island, not far from the home of Theodore Roosevelt, who, Israel notes, also wrote a few good books.

**Constance M. Kehoe** majored in history at Vassar College and received a master's in teaching from Wesleyan University. After teaching high school social studies and special education, she started and ran an educational sales and consulting business, Literacy Warehouse, for 20 years. In 2009 she was elected Village Trustee in Irvington, where she still resides, and served as Trustee of the village for 12 years, with 8 as Deputy Mayor. In 2018 she became the president and a director of Revolutionary Westchester 250, a not-for-profit corporation, to build awareness and excitement for the events, places, ideas, and people — both the unsung and the famous — of the Revolutionary War period in Westchester County, in connection with the 250th Commemoration of the founding of the United States. She serves as the 250th liaison to Westchester County, and as a New York State 250th Commemoration Commissioner. Under her leadership effective partnerships have been forged with grass roots volunteers, government, universities and historic sites. She has received recognition from State Senator and Majority Leader Andrea Stewart Cousins, State Senator Shelley Mayer, County Executive George Latimer and others for her work with the 250th. Connie grew up in South Bend, Indiana.

**Erika Mallin** was appointed by Governor Hochul to lead New York State Council on the Arts in January 2024. Previously she served as the Executive Director of the Arts Program at the Aspen Institute, a global policy non-profit where she convened some of the most iconic cultural leaders of our time. Prior to the Institute, she was the Executive Director of the New York City Tony Award® winning Signature Theatre Company, where she worked with both established and emerging playwrights and creatives. She also led Signature's \$70 million expansion and created one of the nation's first subsidized ticket program to make theater affordable. During her tenure, the program served over 1 million people. Mallin has held positions at Manhattan Theatre Club, Atlantic Theatre Company, and at the New York City's Mayor's Office. Mallin has moderated panels, presented and lectured at Columbia, Yale, NYU, The Kennedy Center and the Aspen Ideas Festival. She has sat on various grant award committees and consulted on arts management for cultural

institutions. She received her M.S. from Columbia University's Graduate School of Journalism and her B.A. from the University of Michigan.

**Louise Mirrer** is President and CEO of the New-York Historical Society, New York's first museum. Under her guidance, the institution has reinvigorated its commitment to greater public understanding of history and its relevance today, as well as to the support and encouragement of historical scholarship, and the education of young people. Before joining New-York Historical in June 2004, Dr. Mirrer was the Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs of the City University of New York, where she established American History as a center of excellence, introduced coursework in American History as a graduation requirement, and designed the CUNY Honors College. Mirrer holds a double Ph.D. from Stanford, a graduate Diploma from Cambridge, and a BA *magna cum laude* from the University of Pennsylvania. She has received honorary degrees from Marymount and Fordham and was awarded the Order of Civil Merit by the Spanish Crown.

**Lisa Romano Moore** is the Executive Director of the Onondaga Historical Association (OHA). OHA operates a comprehensive history museum in Syracuse, the Skā-noñh Great Law of Peace Center on the ancestral, unceded lands of the Onondaga Nation – the Central Fire of the Haudenosaunee Confederacy, a military history installation in the Onondaga County War Memorial, an Aviation History Museum at Syracuse's Hancock International Airport, and several community based installations throughout Onondaga County and the City of Syracuse. Lisa joined OHA in 2020 as the Director of Development and served as the Interim Executive Director, when her predecessor, Gregg Tripoli, retired in 2022. She was named to the position permanently in January of 2023. The first chapter in her professional career began at her alma mater – St. Bonaventure University – where she served as a development officer. Lisa earned a Bachelor of Arts in Mass Communication, and minored in Classics. During the next 30 years she held a variety of positions in higher education and non-profit organizations. She led fundraising efforts for the first city-wide initiative of the Say Yes to Education public/private college readiness and access initiative and was the first Vice President for Marketing and Development at the Central New York Community Foundation. In addition to her alma mater, Lisa's work has supported campaigns at Ithaca College and the Arts and Sciences Foundation at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill. Lisa spent 13 years in advancement at Syracuse University, including roles as Assistant Dean for Advancement in the College of Arts and Sciences, and Assistant Athletic Director in the University's Orange Club office. She most recently held the post of Executive Director of the Onondaga Community College Foundation. Lisa has experience with annual giving, special events, planned giving, capital campaigns, corporate, and foundation relations. In her spare time, she enjoys traveling, running, yoga, cycling, and volunteering. Lisa served on the boards of the American Lung Association, the CNY Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals, On Point for College, and is a current Trustee of the Community Library of Dewitt and Jamesville, and recently completed her final term as a trustee of the Seward House Museum in her hometown of Auburn. She is a Leadership Greater Syracuse alumna – class of 2000 and has been recognized with the Central New York Business Journal's 40 Under 40 and Women in Business awards. She lives in Dewitt and is the proud mother of Hannah and Jack.

**Cristyne L. Nicholas**, Chair of the New York State Tourism Advisory Council since 2012 and co-founder Nicholas & Lence Communications (NLC), a New York-based strategic communications firm in 2007. A Brooklyn native, she received her B.A. from Rutgers University and later attended Columbia University. Ms. Nicholas is well known for her commitment as CEO of NYC & Company for leading the efforts to rebuild NYC's \$27 billion tourism industry following the tragic events of September 11th. She has worked with all facets of the city, state, and national hospitality industry resulting in increased budget revenues from \$10

million to \$35 million annually and launching New York City's first consumer TV advertising campaign, to promote patriotic tourism and recruit national events including the RNC 2004, CMA Awards and GRAMMY Awards, the World Economic Forum, the International Olympic Committee, the American Bus Association (ABA) and the U.S. Travel Association's IPW, sharing the message that NYC is open for business. Ms. Nicholas successfully advocated for the expansion of the Jacob K. Javits Convention Center. **Lauren Roberts** is a graduate of Skidmore College with a dual Bachelor's Degree in Anthropology and American Studies. She received her Master's Degree in Public History from the University at Albany. She currently serves as the Saratoga County Historian, a position which she has held since 2009. In 2017, she co-produced the highly successful documentary *Harnessing Nature: Building the Great Sacandaga*, which chronicles the planning and development of the Great Sacandaga Lake, New York's largest reservoir. In 2019, Lauren signed on as co-host for WAMC Northeast Public Radio's podcast *A New York Minute in History*, which has received two Edward R. Murrow Regional Awards for Best Podcast (2021 and 2023) as well as three New York State Broadcasters Association Awards for Outstanding Podcast in 2021, 2022, and 2024. She currently serves as Chair of the Saratoga County 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution Commission and has been appointed to serve on the New York State 250th Commission.

**Barbara M. Russell** was born and raised on Long Island, in Suffolk County. She holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Mt. St. Vincent and a master's degree from St. Johns University. She formerly worked in the publishing field and as a public librarian. She has been an avid community volunteer since she was 12 years old, serving the arts, history, religious and medical communities. Appointed the Historian for the Town

**Dr. Betty A. Rosa** is the Commissioner of Education and President of the University of the State of New York. Dr. Rosa was appointed as permanent Commissioner on February 8, 2021, by the Board of Regents. She is the first Latina woman to serve in the position. Previously, Dr. Rosa served as Interim Commissioner since August 2020. Prior to that, she served as Chancellor of the Board of Regents since 2016. In 1998, Dr. Rosa was appointed to the position of Superintendent of Community School District 8 in the Bronx and later appointed to serve as the Senior Superintendent of the Bronx. One of the schools Dr. Rosa founded as superintendent, M.S. 101 (Maritime Academy for Science and Technology), became the top ranked middle school in the City of New York based on New York State examination results. She has taught graduate level education courses including Education of Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Exceptional Children, Due Process: Law and the Handicapped, and Applied and Action Research for Doctoral Students, has served on dissertation committees, and is an executive coach for doctoral students. Since 2015, Dr. Rosa has been honored with the Champions of Education Leadership Award from the Alliance for Quality Education, Woman of the Year Award from the New York League of Puerto Rican Women, Heimlich Community Service Award from the Ben Franklin Reform Democratic Club, Transformative Education Leadership Award from the International Chartership High School, Education Leadership Award from the National Puerto Rican Day Parade, Leadership in Education Award from the

Association of Dominican-American Supervisors and Administrators, Women of Distinction Award from the Bronx Chamber of Commerce, and the Latina of the Year Award from the New York State Assembly and Senate's Puerto Rican/Hispanic Task Force.

**Kathy Moser** was nominated by Governor Hochul to serve as Acting Commissioner of the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP) in September 2025. A lifelong New Yorker, she previously served as Chief Conservation and Policy Officer at the Open Space Institute (OSI), an East Coast land trust based in New York. At OSI, Acting Commissioner Moser directed the Parks, Stewardship and Government Relations programs. Before taking on that role in June 2020, she was OSI's Senior Vice President of Parks and Policy.

Prior to OSI, she served as Deputy Commissioner for Natural Resources at the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) from December 2011 to August 2019, where she oversaw the agency's portfolio in Lands and Forests, Fish and Wildlife, and Marine Resources.

Acting Commissioner Moser has also worked as Managing Director for Strategic Initiatives at the World Wildlife Fund and held senior positions at The Nature Conservancy in New York State (Acting State Director) and in its International Program (Regional Director for Central America) from 1992 to 2009. Her career began in 1985 with the Peace Corps, where she managed Cerro Uyuca, a newly established protected area in Honduras. She has also been a board member for the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy and the New York League of Conservation Voters (Capital District).

Acting Commissioner Moser holds an undergraduate degree in botany and a master's degree in forest productivity, both from Duke University. She is fluent in Spanish.

**Devin Lander** is New York's 16th State Historian and Head of Museum Chartering for the State Education Department. Previous to being named State Historian, he was the Executive Director of the Museum Association of New York (MANY) and worked as Deputy Legislative and Policy Director for the Chair of the New York State Assembly's Tourism, Arts, Parks, and Sports Development and Governmental Operations Committees. He holds a BA in History from the State University of New York at Plattsburgh and a MA in Public History from the University at Albany where he is currently completing work on his PhD dissertation. Devin is also co-host of the award-winning podcast *A New York Minute in History*, produced by WAMC-Northeast Public Radio and co-editor of the *New York History* a journal published by Cornell University Press. He was elected as a New York Academy of History Fellow in 2020.

**Ben Walsh** was appointed Director of the New York State Canal Corporation at the recommendation of Governor Kathy Hochul in February 2026. In this role, Walsh oversees the agency responsible for stewardship of the 524-mile canal system, ensuring that the historic waterway and trail system is maintained for navigation and that it continues to serve as a vital driver of New York's Upstate economy.

Prior to joining the Canal Corporation, Walsh served as the 54th Mayor of the City of Syracuse. As the first independent mayor of Syracuse, Walsh was first elected to the position in 2017 and was re-elected in 2021. He concluded his second and final term at the end of 2025 due to term limits.

Walsh's priorities as Mayor included responsible and equitable economic development, improved access to high-quality affordable housing, implementation of the Interstate 81 viaduct project, and investments in workforce development to support the region's growing technology industries.

Before becoming Mayor, Walsh served as Deputy Commissioner of the City's Department of Neighborhood and Business Development where he led projects including the creation of the Greater Syracuse Land Bank and the redevelopment of the Hotel Syracuse.

A native of Syracuse, Walsh's approach to leadership and civic responsibility was shaped in a family of proud public servants. He graduated from Ithaca College before attending the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University, where he earned his Master of Public Administration (MPA). Walsh resides on Syracuse's westside with his wife, Lindsay, and their two daughters. In his spare time, he enjoys spending time with his family, watching Syracuse University sports, and exploring urban and rural landscapes.

**Hope Knight** is the President, CEO and Commissioner of Empire State Development, New York State's economic development agency. She was nominated to the position by Governor Kathy Hochul in October 2021 and confirmed by the New York State Senate in May 2022. At ESD, Commissioner Knight is dedicated to policies that advance sustainable and inclusive economic growth. She has been instrumental in the creation of the state's Office of Strategic Workforce Development, which will focus on improving New York's workforce development programs and practices to better align with the needs and priorities of today's employers. Knight has also focused efforts on supporting New York State's small businesses, ensuring that they have the resources needed to grow and thrive, and growing the state's Minority and Women-Owned Business community. Prior to her appointment, Commissioner Knight served as President & CEO of Greater Jamaica Development Corporation, one of the nation's first community development corporations. In that capacity, she advanced economic growth, community-building, and sustainable real estate development that has immeasurably revitalized and strengthened the Southeast Queens region. Additionally, from 2015 to 2021 she was a Commissioner on the New York City Planning Commission. Commissioner Knight was Chief Operating Officer of the Upper Manhattan Empowerment Zone, overseeing more than \$150 million in investments and leveraging over \$1 billion in private capital. She also served as a Vice President at Morgan Stanley in domestic and international capacities. Earlier in her career, Knight worked at Accenture and in New York City government. She holds a BA from Marymount Manhattan College and an MBA from the Graduate School of Business of the University of Chicago.

**Walter T. Mosley** was formerly President and Chief Executive Officer at Mosley Advisory Group. Founded in February 2021, the Mosley Advisory Group (MAG) was a full-service government and corporate relations firm with a concentration in emerging markets and overseas economic market initiatives, industrial development, alternative energy, and adult use cannabis. Mr. Mosley worked as a national and international public relations strategist and offered his expertise in a variety of resources including a combined brand of skills necessary to reach crucial community members and critical legislators. In this role Mr. Mosley provided a unique approach to solving problems with government by utilizing an integrated strategy of lobbying, communications, social media, and grassroots efforts, masterfully designed to achieve his client's designated goals. Prior to Mr. Mosley's private sector engagements, he represented the New York State Assembly within the New York State Legislature. From 2013 to 2020 Mr. Mosley represented communities in central Brooklyn encompassing the neighborhoods of Fort Greene, Clinton Hill, Prospect Heights and parts of Bedford

Stuyvesant and Crown Heights. Over those years Mr. Mosley was a staunch advocate for his constituents both in Albany and within his district. Individually and alongside his colleagues, Mr. Mosley worked to pass crucial legislation to protect New Yorkers from unscrupulous landlords, furthered criminal justice reform practices, and expanded affordable housing opportunities on several fronts throughout his district and state. Mr. Mosley was a contributor and advocate for the legalization of adult-use cannabis in New York State. Through his work on criminal justice reform and decriminalization of the practice, Mr. Mosley accomplished these measures serving as Co-chair of the New York State Legislature's Black, Puerto Rican, Hispanic and Asian Caucus's Marijuana Regulation and Taxation Task Force on Cannabis. From his leadership Mr. Mosley ensured that social equity firms and businesses would have a fair opportunity to be involved in the economic rollout of the adult use cannabis industry in New York State. Mr. Mosley was also a member of the Black, Puerto Rican, Hispanic and Asian Legislative Caucus (BPHA), the Jewish Caucus, and the Hispanic Task Force. In his capacity as a BPHA Caucus member, Mr. Mosley served as Second Vice-chair and as the Budget Chair. Mr. Mosley was a member of the New York State Caucus of Environmental Legislators; State Legislators Against Illegal Guns (SLAIG); The American State Legislators for Gun Violence Prevention (ASLGVP); and served on the bi-partisan Leaders Eradicating All Poverty (LEAP) - an initiative to combat poverty, wage discrimination, and income inequality throughout New York State. Likewise, Mr. Mosley served on the New York State Assembly's Anti-Poverty Workgroup. Some of his distinguished honors include: 2016/2017 New York State Delegation - 75th Anniversary Attack on Pearl Harbor (Honolulu, HI & Nagasaki, Japan); 2017/2018 Senior Fellow with Massachusetts Institute of Technology - Advancing Economic Democracy and Development (Mondragon, Spain); 2019 New York State D-Day Delegation - 75th Anniversary Normandy Invasion (Normandy, France); and 2020 New York State Poland Legislative Delegation - 75th Anniversary of Auschwitz Liberation (Krakow, Poland). Mr. Mosley has had a long history of public service throughout his life. He served as a Legislative Analyst and Oversight Investigator for the New York City Council and went on to serve as Senior Consultant to the New York State Assembly, and Senior Advisor to the Deputy Speaker of the New York State Assembly prior to becoming a member of the New York Legislature in 2013. In 2008 Mr. Mosley was a New York State Pledged Delegate for President Barack Obama on behalf of the 10th Congressional District. Likewise, Mr. Mosley was a New York State Pledged Delegate for Secretary of State Hilary Clinton on behalf of the 8th Congressional District in 2016. As a college lecturer, Mr. Mosley has shared his knowledge and experiences on the inner workings of government with students across the United States, while at the same time he has continued his own educational advancement. In 2016 Mr. Mosley was selected by the Institute for State & Local Governance at the City University of New York as a part of its inaugural John Lindsay Fellowship. Named in honor of former New York City Mayor John Lindsay. In 2017 Mr. Mosley was selected as a Council of State Government Henry Toll Fellow; and in 2019 Mr. Mosley was accepted into the Harvard Kennedy School of Government's Strategies for Building and Leading Diverse Organizations program with a concentration on emerging global economic issues. Mr. Mosley is a graduate of The Pennsylvania State University where he received his BS in criminology and minored in African Studies and African American History; he is also a graduate from Howard University School of Law in Washington, DC. 1998. Mr. Mosley currently lives in Albany, New York; he is married to Julie Mosley. They have two children, Sebastien, and Allyson.

**Jeanette Moy** was appointed Commissioner of the New York State Office of General Services (OGS) by Governor Kathy Hochul in October 2021 and was unanimously confirmed by the New York State Senate in February 2022. As Commissioner, she also serves as a member of Governor Hochul's Cabinet. Under Commissioner Moy's leadership, OGS is implementing a comprehensive strategic plan to improve how the agency operates, making it more data-driven, sustainable, and responsive. She launched a new Division of

Resiliency and Sustainability to help meet statewide climate goals, which include converting the State's light-duty fleet to all zero-emission vehicles by 2035, reducing greenhouse gas emissions 85 percent by 2050, and adapting OGS's assets and operations to the increasing impacts of climate change. Commissioner Moy is also driving improvements in how the State utilizes and maintains its State assets, infrastructure, and facilities. She is ensuring OGS is taking the steps necessary to support Governor Hochul's efforts to put underutilized and surplus State property to productive use. She is leading efforts to modernize the State's operations, including capital design and construction initiatives, e-procurement systems, and leveraging New York's immense buying power to reduce government costs and achieve the State's crucial environmental and economic goals. Under Governor Hochul's leadership, Commissioner Moy oversaw OGS's establishment of the State's new Office of Language Access to ensure New Yorkers with limited English proficiency have access to the State's vital programs and services in their primary language. Before coming to OGS, Commissioner Moy served as the EVP and Chief Operating Officer at Public Health Solutions, Chief Operating Officer at the NYS Office of the Attorney General, Chief Strategy Officer at Brooklyn Public Library, Deputy Chief of Staff and Senior Policy Advisor at the NYC Mayor's Office. She received her BA and MS from the University of Rochester. She resides in the Capital Region with her husband and children.
